PRIVACY POLICY UNDER UE 679/2016 REGULATION (GDPR)

Legister pays particular attention to privacy protection and by mean of this policy intends to inform users and visitors of the website www.legister.it (hereinafter, "Website") with reference to the methods of personal data treatment of those who connect to the website and interact with it. This privacy policy only concerns the Website and not other websites possibly consulted by the user through links.

Type of data processed

a) Navigation data

The computer system responsible for the operation of this site acquire, during normal operation, some personal data that are then implicitly transmitted in the use of internet communication protocols. This is information that it is not collected to be associated with identified data subjects, but which by its very nature could, through processing and association with data held by third parties, allow users to be identified. This category of data includes IP addresses or domain names of the computers used by users connecting to the site, the addresses in the Uniform Resource Identifier (URI) notation of the requested resources, the time of request, the method used to submit the request to the server, the size of the file obtained in response, the numerical code indicating the staus of the response given by the server and other parameters relating to the operating system and to the user's computer environment. These data are used for the sole purpose of obtaining anonymous statistical information on the use of the Website and to check its correct functioning and are deleted immediately after processing. The data could be used to ascertain responsibility in the event of any computer crimes to the detriment of the Website.

b) Data provided voluntarily by users/visitors

Apart from that specified in point a), the user is free to provide his personal data to take advantage of services accessible from the Website. In this case, if users/visitors by connecting to the Website have to send their personal data to access certain services or to make requests, this will involve the acquisition by Legister of the sender's e mail address and/or possible other personal data, that will be processed solely to respond to the request or to provide the service. Failure to provide personal data may result in the impossibility of obtining the requested service. Specific information pursuant to UE 679/2016 regulation will be reported in the pages of the Website prepared for particular services.

Cookies

Cookies are not used to transmit personal information, neither any c.d. "persistent cookies" or user tracking systems are used.

Methods of data processing

The personal data of Website users/visitors are processed with automated tools for the strictly necessary time due for the achievement of the purposes for which they are collected and in compliance with the principles set forth in GDPR Section 5: lawfulness, correctness, transparency, data minimization, accuracy, integrity and confidentiality. Legister observe specific security measures to prevent data loss, illicit or incorrect use and unauthorized access.

Place of data processing

Processing of personal data of Website users/visitors takes place in Legister offices in Milan, Via Amedei 15 and is performed by persons authorized to process personal data pursuant to GDPR Section 28. No data deriving from navigation or use of the Website will be circulated to third parties nor transferred to third countries or international organizations.

Purpose of data processing

The personal data of Website users/visitors are processed to allow Legister provide its services.

Rights of the data subject

Pursuant to GDPR Section 15 - 23, the data subject can exercise the following rights: right to access to his personal data (Section 15) that is the right to receive any information as far as data processing is concerned; right to rectification should personal data be inaccurate (Section 16); right to erasure (Section 17); right to restriction of processing (Section 18); right to data portability (Section 20), that is the right to obtain personal data in a commonly used format; right to object (Section 21); right to revoke any consent given and to propose a complaint to a supervisory authority in case personal data are processed in violation of applicable laws.
